Ms. Coram referenced the District's 2022 Safety Initiative and the WSCO audit which did not specify that the entirety of NatureWalk signs be replaced with FDOT signage. Ms. Coram asked if stop signs that remain on wooden posts could be the cause of the disconnect with WCSO deputies failing to issue citations in the community.

- Lt. Wendell confirmed that the required standard is that stop signs must be installed so that their bottom edge is seven (7) feet from the ground. Lt. Wendell will perform a second audit, accompanied by Ms. Coram.
- Lt. Wendell will notify Lt John Cheek and all WCSO deputies that an MOU is in effect in NatureWalk.
- Ms. Coram informed Lt. Wendell that the District's petition to lower the speed limit on CR395 to 25mph north of NatureWalk had been approved by the Board of County Commissioners. She asked if a flashing informational sign could be placed on CR395 to inform motorists of the change.
- Lt. Wendell stated WCSO could coordinate this with County Engineer Chance Powell. Mr. Martelli will contact Mr. Powell to facilitate.
- Ms. Head relayed a resident's concern that WCSO are parking on the new sod, resulting in damage to turf and irrigation heads, and requested this be not done during future patrols.
- Lt. Wendell stated that the catalytic converters of parked WCSO vehicles can cause pine straw to combust, so alternative parking locations may need to be explored.
- Lt. Wendell thanked the Board of Supervisors (BOS) for continuing to fund two Flock cameras. He stated that WCSO utilized NatureWalk cameras in two major arrests.

Hi Jonette.

Thanks for the information below and hope you had a good time away.

Regarding the priority alleys in need of repair, I would also agree with your assessment in my professional opinion.

Considering, if I understand the below correctly, that there is total budget for 2024/2025 roadway rehabilitation projects of \$100,000 and considering that the previous construction bid by Pat Shea Concrete is above that amount for the alley from the Sport Courts to 260 FFL, and considering the priority list identified above, we believe two options could be considered in our opinion.

The first option would be to complete the alley replacement for 620 to 694 FFL. This Alley consists of approximately 4,660 square feet of concrete pavement, or about 66% of the size of the Sports Court Alley. So, most likely, the entire Alley could be replaced under the allowable budget with some funds left over. Any remaining left-over funds could be carried forward to next year and hopefully would allow enough to compete the Sports Court alley in 2025/2026.

The second option would be to phase the replacement for the Sports Courts Alley into 2 phases, one phase this budget year and the second phase next budget year when the funds becomes available. Say for instance, the first phase could be 70% of the Alley and next year complete the last 30% plus the 620 to 694 FFL Alley if budget allows. We would have to determine a good location for a cold joint as obviously there would need to be one.

In either option, we would highly recommend leaving some monies in budget for a strip survey and civil engineering tasks to review existing conditions, modify rehabilitation design for items such as drainage, if necessary, prior to finalizing drawings for bid and providing limited construction administration for bidding / pay application process.

In my opinion, it seems like Option 1 would be a little cleaner, but Option 2 is also viable if that is the Board's wishes.

Also, on a final note, we have completed a preliminary version of the rehabilitation / replacement drawings for the 620 to 694 Alley Option, please see attached.

Good morning, Jim. I did a quick audit of NW alleys. It appears that the two alleys most in need of repair are:

- 620-694 Flatwoods Forest Loop (some areas show patching has taken place already)
- 260 Flatwoods Forest Loop to the intersection of FFL at the Sports Courts (Note: we have a 2023 proposal of \$112,848 for the entire alley but only \$100K available in FY24-25)
 - o 268-276 FFL
 - o 300-316 FFL
 - 334 FFL to the FFL Sandgrass intersection

Future alley areas in need of repair include:

- 13 47 River Oats
- 15 59 Chordgrass (some sections were already patched by the developer, possibly in 2017 or 2018)
- 830-856 Sandgrass
 - Intersection of 27 Lily Lane & 844 Sandgrass Blvd
- Manholes between 633-701 FFL

I do not yet have any data to show that any of these areas have standing water during a hard rain - looks like the weather isn't going to cooperate with us during the next ten days.

I am out of town Oct 14-16, but if you'd like, I can meet with you either before or after that in order to inspect the areas so that you ar able to prepare a recommendation for the November 7 meeting. Photos are attached, but it's difficult to gauge the depth of missing concrete from them alone.

Ideally, Rizzetta needs documents for the 11/7 agenda packet no later than 11/4 if possible.

NatureWalk Community Development District, a local unit of special- purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, located in Clay County, Florida (the "District"), and

NatureWalk Homeowners' Association, Inc., a Florida Not-For-Profit Corporation, with an address of 120 Richard Jackson Boulevard, Suite 220, Panama City Beach, Florida 32407 (the "Licensee").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to and governed by Chapter 190, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the District owns, operates, and maintains certain facilities and real property ("District Property"), which facilities and real property are within the boundaries of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Licensee desires to install certain fence improvements ("Fence Improvements") and parking improvements ("Parking Improvements", collectively the ("Improvements")) on District property, on certain District Property as generally identified in Exhibit A, which is attached and incorporated herein, for the benefit of the community, and at no cost to the District: and

WHEREAS, the District is willing to allow the Licensee to supply, install, and maintain the Improvements pursuant to the terms set forth in this License Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the District and the Licensee warrant and agree that they have all right, power, and authority to enter into and be bound by this License Agreement.

Now, THEREFORE, based upon good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the parties, the receipt of which and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the District and the Licensee agree as follows:

1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. The Recitals stated above are true and correct and are incorporated herein as a material part of this License Agreement.

- 2. Grant of Installation And Maintenance License. The District hereby grants to the Licensee a non-exclusive license ("License") to access, install and maintain the Improvements on District property at the locations generally identified in Exhibit A ("License Area"). Prior to installation of any Improvements, any construction plans (or other materials reasonably requested by the District) shall be provided to the District for review and approval. The design, installation, and maintenance of the Improvements shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of all governmental bodies and their respective regulatory agencies having any jurisdiction over the License Area. Any modifications or additions to the Improvements must first be approved in writing by the District. Upon Licensee's completion of the Improvements and inspection and approval by the District, which shall be given after inspection of the Improvements in its sole discretion: (i) Licensee shall submit as-built drawings of the Improvements; and (ii) the District may in its sole discretion elect to take ownership and maintenance responsibility for the Parking Improvements.
- **3. CONDITIONS ON THE LICENSE.** The License granted herein is subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - **A.** Licensee's access to District Property under this License Agreement is limited to reasonable ingress and egress to install and maintain the Improvements.
 - **B.** Licensee's use License is limited to that set forth in this License Agreement.
 - **C.** Licensee shall exercise its best efforts to maintain the Improvements in a good condition and free from visual deterioration.
 - **D.** Licensee shall be solely responsible for any and all costs or fees associated with the acquisition, installation, maintenance, repair, replacement, operation and monitoring of the Improvements.
 - **E.** District makes no representation or warranty regarding the condition of the License Area or whether the use contemplated by this Agreement is allowed under applicable law, restrictions, or zoning requirements. Licensee accepts the License Area in its present "AS IS" condition. Licensee shall make no alterations or changes to the License Area without the District's written consent.
 - **F.** Licensee shall abide by all reasonable directions and requirements of District and any insurance company insuring the License Area.
- **4. MAINTENANCE.** Licensee shall be responsible for maintaining the Improvements and any associated costs and shall maintain the License Area and Improvements in a clean, safe, and sightly condition.
 - **5.** TERMINATION OF LICENSES. [Reserved].

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- **6. EFFECTIVE DATE; TERM.** This License Agreement shall become effective on the date first written above and shall continue in full force and effect until revoked or terminated earlier in accordance with Section 7. herein.
- 7. REVOCATION, SUSPENSION AND 7. TERMINATION. The District and the Licensee acknowledge and agree that the License granted herein is a mere privilege and may be suspended or revokedterminated, with or without cause, at the sole discretion of the District. In the event the District exercises its right to suspend or revoke the License, the District shall provide Licensee written notice of the suspension or revocation, which notice shall be effective immediately upon receipt by Licensee. Both the District and Licensee may terminate this License Agreement upon thirty (30) days' written notice. The provisions of Sections 9 and 10, below, shall survive any revocation, suspension or In the event License terminates the License Agreement, or the District terminates the License Agreement for cause, Licensee shall be responsible for removing any Improvements that have not been conveyed to the District from the District Property and returning the District Property as nearly as practicable to its condition prior to this License Agreement. In the event the District terminates the License Agreement without cause, the District shall be responsible for removing any Improvements from the District Property as determined in its discretion. The provisions of Sections 9 and 10, below, shall survive termination of this License Agreement.
- **8. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, RULES AND POLICIES.** Licensee shall comply at all times with relevant statutes and regulations governing the installation of the Improvements and shall, upon request of the District, provide proof of such compliance.
- 9. CARE OF PROPERTY. Licensee agrees to use all due care to protect the property of the District, its patrons and guests from damage. Licensee shall assume responsibility for any and all damage to any real or personal property of the District or any third parties as a result of the Licensee's activities under this License Agreement, including any damage caused by its authorized representatives or contractor. Licensee shall repair any damage resulting from its operations under this License Agreement within a reasonable time and shall use its best efforts to make such repairs within twenty-four (24) hours. Any such repairs shall be at Licensee's sole expense, unless otherwise agreed, in writing, by the District. The provisions of this Section 9 shall survive termination of this License Agreement.

10. INDEMNIFICATION.

- **A.** Obligations under this Section shall include the payment of all settlements, judgments, damages, liquidated damages, penalties, forfeitures, back pay awards, court costs, arbitration and/or mediation costs, litigation expenses, attorney fees and paralegal fees (incurred in court, out of court, on appeal, or in bankruptcy proceedings) as ordered.
- **B.** For ten dollars (\$10.00) and other valuable consideration paid by the District to Licensee separate and apart from the consideration stated in the recitals, Licensee agrees to defend, indemnify, save and hold the District, and its

supervisors, staff, and assigns harmless from all loss, damage or injury, including all judgments, liens, liabilities, debts and obligations resulting from the acts or omissions of Licensee, its members, managers, agents, contractor, assigns or employees arising out of, or relating to, this License Agreement.

- C. The indemnification rights herein contained shall be cumulative of, and in addition to, any and all rights, remedies and recourse to which the District shall be entitled, whether pursuant to some other provision of this License Agreement, at law, or in equity. The provisions of this Section 10 shall survive the termination or expiration of this License Agreement. Licensee further agrees that nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other statute.
- D. Should the District take ownership of and assume the maintenance responsibility for any of the Improvements, the Licensee's indemnification obligations under this Section 10 shall terminate in connection with such Improvements.
- 11. INSURANCE. Licensee shall, at its own expense, maintain insurance during the term of this License with limits of liability not less than the following:

Workers Compensation statutory

General Liability

Bodily Injury (including contractual) \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000
Property Damage (including contractual) \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000

Automobile Liability Bodily Injury

Property Damage Combined Single Limit \$1,000,000

Licensee shall provide to District, prior to the commencement of any performance under this contract, a certificate naming the District as an additional insured. At no time shall Licensee be without insurance in the above amounts. No policy may be canceled during the term of this Agreement without at least thirty (30) days' written notice to the District.

- 12. LIMITATIONS ON GOVERNMENTAL LIABILITY. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed as a waiver of the District's sovereign immunity or the District's limits of liability as set forth in Section 768.28, *Florida Statutes*, or other statute, and nothing in this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of any third party for the purpose of allowing any claim which would otherwise be barred under such limitations of liability or by operation of law.
- 13. RECOVERY OF COSTS AND FEES. In the event the District is required to enforce this License Agreement by court proceedings or otherwise, then if successful, the District shall be entitled to recover from the Licensee all fees and costs incurred, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

- **14. DEFAULT.** A default by either party under this License Agreement shall entitle the other party to all remedies available at law or in equity, which includes, but is not limited to, the rights of damages, injunctive relief, and specific performance.
- **15. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of the agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter of this License Agreement.
- **16. AMENDMENT.** Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this License Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by both of the parties hereto.
- 17. ASSIGNMENT. Neither the District nor the Licensee may assign its rights, duties or obligations under this License Agreement without the prior written approval of the other. Any purported assignment without said written authorization shall be void.
- 18. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. In all matters relating to this License Agreement, Licensee shall act as an independent contractor. Neither Licensee nor any individual employed by Licensee in connection with the activities contemplated by this Licensee Agreement, is an employee of the District under the meaning or application of any federal or state laws. Licensee agrees to assume all liabilities and obligations imposed by one or more of such laws with respect to its employees. Licensee shall have no authority to assume or create any obligation, express or implied, on behalf of the District and Licensee shall have no authority to represent the District as agent, employee or in any other capacity.
- 19. NOTICES. All notices, requests, consents, and other communications hereunder ("Notices") shall be in writing and shall be delivered, mailed by overnight courier or First Class Mail, postage prepaid, to the parties as follows:

Notices delivered after 5:00 p.m. (at the place of delivery) or on a non-business day, shall be deemed received on the next business day. If any time for giving Notice contained in this License Agreement would otherwise expire on a non-business day, the Notice period shall be extended to the next succeeding business day. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays recognized by the United States government shall not be regarded as business days. Counsel for the District and counsel for the Licensee may deliver Notice on behalf of the District and the Licensee. Any party or other person to whom Notices are to be sent or copied may notify the other parties and addressees of any change in name or address to which Notices shall be sent by providing the same on five (5) days' written notice to the parties and addressees set forth herein.

- **20. INTERFERENCE BY THIRD PARTY.** The District shall be solely responsible for enforcing its rights under this License Agreement against any interfering party. Nothing contained herein shall limit or impair the District's right to protect its rights from interference by a third party to this License Agreement.



1. Introduction

a. Purpose of Assessment

Per the clients' request, a structural assessment was performed on the (4) timber vehicular bridges with attached pedestrian walkways to determine the current condition of the structural components and systems.

b. Methods and Techniques

The assessment was limited to the use of visual, non-destructive techniques on the decks, superstructure, substructure, bearings, and railing of the bridges.

i. Data Collection and Documentation

This includes but is not limited to visual observations, photographs, and measurements.

2. <u>Description of Structures</u>

All bridges and walkways are comprised of timber construction with the following elements.

a. Decks

4"x12" deck boards along the vehicular travel lanes and 3"x8" deck boards along the pedestrian walkways. A 2"x6" layer of wear decking has been installed within vehicular travel lanes for all bridges except for bridge 4.

b. Superstructure

i. Stringers- 6"X16" at 14" o.c. (vehicular lanes), 3"x12" at 14" o.c. (pedestrian wakways).

ii. Edge Beams- 8"x16"

iii. Trusses/Rafters (Bridge 1)- These elements appear to be comprised

of 4" wide rough-cut timbers of various

depths.

c. Substructure

i. Piles- 12" round (main/abutment)

10" round (wing walls)

ii. Pile Caps- 12"x12"

iii. Abutments/Wingwalls- 4"x12" horizontal boards attached to face

of abutment piles.

d. Bearings

All members bear directly atop adjacent members with no supplemental bearing elements installed.





CHECKS

Are separations of the wood fibers in a longitudinal Wood Defects direction, not penetrating as far as the opposite or adjoining side of a piece of sawn timber; they usually result from strains developing during seasoning; Surface (or Seasoning) Checks, and End (or Heart) Checks are distinguished.

DECAY

Timber decay (rot) is caused by a biological attack within the wood by certain species offungi. The fungus can lie dormant in the timber for years until the right conditions present themselves. The conditions needed are oxygen, moisture and nutrients, with moisture being the critical component. If moisture is not present in timber, then the fungi will remain dormant, even when oxygen and the nutrients they require are abundant.

DELAMINATION

Timber delamination can be defined as the separation or disintegration of fibers as a result of physical or chemical processes resulting in fracturing.

DISTORTION

Timber distortion is a deviation from flatness in timber as a result of stresses and uneven shrinkage.

SCOUR

Bridge scour is the removal of sediment such as sand and gravel from around bridge abutments or piles.

SHAKES

Is a longitudinal separation of the fibers which extends to the opposite face or adjoining edge of a piece of sawn timber.

SETTLEMENT

The total vertical displacement that occurs at foundation level is termed as settlement.
